#### **READ**

From "A Wall of Remembrance", by Brent Ashabranner: "The outpouring of messages and mementos left at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial is unique; no other national memorial has evoked such a response."

From the "Researching the Vietnam War" website: Use your research checklist, and the notes you took as you were reading/viewing the information provided on the site.

#### **THINK**

Think about how these quotes relate to the Vietnam Veterans Memorial Wall. Consider how the wall impacts veterans, families of veterans, civilians, and citizens. What does the wall represent to those who have lost loved ones and the symbol to those who have not lost loved ones, and the symbol of freedom and sacrifice for our country?

- ✓ organize ideas logically and link them with transitions
- ✓ develop your ideas fully and thoughtfully, including appropriate facts and details (give credit to your sources) to illustrate your points
- ✓ Does your research support your statement?
- ✓ make sure your FINAL composition is no longer than one page.
